

OPENING PERFORMANCE

Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui BELGIUM w/ A Filetta CORSICA Apocrifu 2007

Highly esteemed on the European dance stage, Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui opens this year's Dublin Dance Festival with his beautiful and haunting work, *Apocrifu*. Weaving together the contrasting styles of its three dancers and the soaring polyphonic choral music of A Filetta, *Apocrifu* is a powerful and thought-provoking work. *Apocrifu* is at times earthbound and languid, at others delicate and aerial. Through painful struggle and humorous absurdity, the dancers question the authority of written traditions. Cherkaoui investigates the ubiquity of the written word to open up a dialogue with forgotten tales and sacred texts deemed by many to be absolute.

A former dancer with Les Ballets C de la B, Cherkaoui was awarded the Promising Choreographer Award at the Nijinski Awards in Monte Carlo in 2002 and received BalletTanz's Outstanding Choreographer of the Year Award in 2008. His work has been commissioned by the Royal Danish Ballet and the Cullberg Ballet. Recent collaborations include *Zero Degrees* with Akram Khan (UK) and the Monks from the Shaolin Temple and sculptor Antony Gormley for the creation of *Sutra*. Cherkaoui is currently Associate Artist at both Het Toneelhuis in Belgium and Sadler's Wells in London.



Evidence, A Dance Company – Artistic Director Ronald K. Brown USA One Shot 2007

Praised as "one of the most profound choreographers of his generation" by The New York Times, Ronald K. Brown and the award-winning Evidence, A Dance Company blend African, modern, ballet, and social dance styles to tell the stories of the African Diaspora. In *One Shot*, Brown was inspired by the beauty, sense of community and legacy captured by the great African American photographer Charles "Teenie" Harris, nicknamed "One Shot", because that was all he needed to capture each photograph. *One Shot* delves into the essence of family, hope, dignity and celebration at the heart of Harris' art and is both a thoughtful reflection of African American history and universal in theme and resonance.

Evidence, A Dance Company was founded by Ronald K. Brown in Brooklyn, New York, in 1985. Brown uses movement as a way to reinforce the importance of community in African American culture and to acquaint audiences with the beauty of traditional African forms and rhythms. In high demand, he has choreographed for Alvin Ailey American Dance Theatre, Ailey II, Cleo Parker Robinson Ensemble, Dayton Contemporary Dance Company, Jennifer Muller/The Works and Jeune Ballet d'Afrique Noire, among others. In autumn 2006 Brown received one of the first United States Artists' Rose Fellowships.

"We are fallen. We have come up. When you get the chance to move on, we move on." *Fall and Recover* is a moving work created by John Scott in 2004 in collaboration with survivors of torture from CCST (Centre for Care for Survivors of Torture) and especially revived for Dublin Dance Festival 2009. The piece draws upon and highlights their extraordinary presence, dignity and determination. Cast members have lost homes, careers, family and health but their dance celebrates the power of the human spirit and carries imprints from their lives and future hopes. Rossa Ó Snodaigh's live music subtly underpins these unspoken shared fragments.

John Scott is one of Ireland's most highly acclaimed and provocative choreographers. Since founding Irish Modern Dance Theatre in 1991, Scott has pioneered innovative dance expression and promoted dialogue with international choreographers and audiences to achieve this end. The company has performed all over Ireland, in New York and in various European countries.

As the night wears on and the drink takes hold, bar stool philosophy turns to bar floor desperation.

London-based Wendy Houstoun brings Happy Hour back to Dublin after successful worldwide touring. Houstoun's collaborative and solo works have been awarded internationally in New York, Australia and Italy; she is currently Artist in Residence at Greenwich Dance Agency, London. In addition to her own work, Houstoun has performed with DV8, Forced Entertainment and has mentored artists in Australia and Ireland, as well as in the U.K.

L'A. / Rachid Ouramdane FRANCE Loin... (Far...) 2008

Based on his father's journals written during the French occupation of Algeria and his subsequent time fighting for the French in Indochina, and on official and unofficial memories of others, Ouramdane asks, how do people deal with the aftermath of violence? From Algeria to Vietnam and Cambodia, *Loin...* retraces the steps of a journey made over 50 years ago. Ouramdane's solo investigates the layered and ever-changing nature of identity – identities we inherit, create, project and abandon. *Loin...* is a multimedia performance rather than pure choreography. Dance sequences meditate, flail and undulate, integrating with video footage, a pedal controlled sound score and rushes of Ouramdane's beat-inspired poetry.

Choreographing since 1996, Rachid Ouramdane created the company L'A. in 2007 as a vehicle for artistic exploration of contemporary identities.



Work in Regress 2007

Have you ever wondered what happened to *Animal Farm's* Mr. Jones after the animals kicked him out? What happens to someone who is used to being the master if there's nothing to be master of? After the success of *Portrait* at DDF 08, Ioana Mona Popovici returns to DDF 09 to explore just these questions. Bizarre new rituals unfold as the determined farmer attempts to bring something, anything, under his control. Darkly humorous, *Work in Regress* looks at the interdependence of master and property, playing out the former master's adaptation to his own obsolescence.

Choreographer Lucy Guerin takes the 1970 collapse of Melbourne's Westgate Bridge as a starting point for *Structure and Sadness*. A complex and arresting dance work, *Structure and Sadness* bases its movement vocabulary on the engineering principles of compression, suspension, torsion and failure. On stage, the six dancers construct a precarious world teetering on the point of breakdown. From the concrete and definable forms of the bridge under construction to the grief and chaos that followed, *Structure and Sadness* presents a physical, emotional and visual response to a devastating accident.

Guerin collaborates with motion graphics designer Michaela French, Scottish composer Gerald Mair and set and lighting designers Bluebottle. *Structure and Sadness* was awarded a 2007 Helpmann Award for Best Dance Work and an Australian Dance Award for Outstanding Performance by a Company.






